- Overnights
  - Popular Camping Spots: Mt. Diablo, Lost Ridge, Camp Herms, Del Valle, Henry Coe, Sunset State Beach, Dillon Beach, and Snow Camping in the Sierras
- Hiking/Backpacking

- Mistletoe Campout
  - The Mistletoe Campout is a weekend camp held at a private estate in December, and has been an annual Troop tradition for the last 25 years. The campout includes collecting mistletoe from trees to offer later for donations, all of which goes to a non-profit organization. The Mistletoe Campout is a great way for Scouts to help out those in need and have fun as well!
- Scout Summer Camp(Camp Wolfeboro)
  - Camp Wolfeboro is a week-long camp in the High Sierra Nevada Mountains. The camp offers an extensive program to work on Merit Badges, as well as Swimming and a Shooting Range. Scouts can also attempt the "Sourdough", a light backpacking trip.
- Lock-In:
  - The Lock-In is an annual outing our Troop has over Presidents' Day Weekend, which includes Scouts spending the night in our meeting spot and playing many different types of games, including video games, card games, and board games. Scouts can also help bake cookies for the Troop to eat.
- Scout Sunday
  - Scout Sunday is a nationwide Scouting event, which our Troop celebrates by giving back to the Church that gave us a place to hold meetings. On Scout Sunday, our Troop helps the Church in their services, from helping prepare food to handing out church bulletins to the service attendees.

- How We Do Outings Now:
