

Registration

Troops & Webelos - here are important registration deadlines:

- → All participating units **must** register online by **September 6, 2021**.
- → We will base our T-Shirt order on the registration numbers in your
 September 6rd registration submission.
- → Balance in full or a minimum 80% of the invoice amount is due no later than September 6rd.
- → The last date to submit a revised registration is September 22nd.
- → Any balance due is payable no later than September 22nd.

There will be no refunds on overpayments based on current council policy.

- All scouts and adults coming to camporee MUST be registered with their Troop using the online registration process.
 Note: Youth Staff must be registered with their troop.
- 2) Each Unit **must** have Medical Forms Part A & Part B for each Scout including any Youth Staff at camp. Keep the Medical Forms with the Unit and readily and easily available if needed for a medical issue.
- 3) As needed, all registered adults will be asked to help with events, inspections, and logistics throughout the duration of Camp.
- 4) Scouts who wish to participate in events that involve Rifles, Tomahawks, or BB guns must bring 2 copies of the **Parental Firearms Permission** form.

Health & Safety

Health & Safety Chair: Brent Nicolai

Health & Safety Asst: Eric Mau

Key Points:

- → Bring Medical forms (Part A/B) for ALL participants Units are responsible for keeping medical forms available at all times if needed by adult leadership or Camporee medical staff.
- → We will require proof of attendee being fully vaccinated or proof of a negative COVID test within 72 hours of arriving at camp. The verification of these items and passing the Council health checklist and temperature check must be managed by the troops and performed prior to arrival at camp.
- → Masks must be worn at all times (except sleeping) and scouts must sleep head to toe and no more than 2 per tent
- → Troops & Packs are expected to be self sufficient in treating minor injuries and accidents. A medic will be on-site on Saturday to address more serious issues if any should occur.
- → Each Unit needs a Safety Officer who:
 - Will have the medical forms & COVID verifications
 - ◆ Is the primary contact on safety issues between Camporee Staff, your Unit, and your Scouts' Families, if needed.
 - Is responsible for developing and communicating a Unit evacuation plan including the ability to verify that all unit members are accounted for.
- → Each Unit must be prepared to clear any equipment from the Event field in ten minutes or less in the event an Air Evacuation
 * If necessary, a helicopter would land on the events field
- → Make sure to prepare for the heat. Bring sun protection. Water flavoring is advisable because some campers avoid drinking the camp's well water.

Saturday Night Campfire!

Key Points

- Located in the main Campfire bowl just beyond the Events field
- Everyone is invited
- Includes OA Callout, Skits, Songs, and Scout Vespers. Troops should come prepared with a skit and song.
- There will be an Order of the Arrow event for ALL Arrowmen and candidates after the call-out. Bring your sash or red arrow.
- Look for opportunities to sign up your Patrol for a skit or song.
 We will award competition bonus points to those who sign up even if they are not selected to perform.
- Patrol Leaders Come to Camporee with a fun original skit!

Sunday: Awards, Clean-Up, & Check-Out

Key Points:

- → The Awards Ceremony will occur right after flags on Sunday morning.
- → Patrol competition results will be posted at the flagpole after the ceremony Sunday morning.
- → Camp Sweep will occur immediately at the end of the Awards Ceremony. All troops will be asked to sweep the lower camp areas.
 - All trash needs to be taken home with you. There is no garbage collection at Camp.
- → Checkout Process at registration tables in Manzanita:
 - SPLs and SMs need to turn in evaluation forms
 - Youth Staff will go with the SPL to the campsite and inspect for Leave No Trace
 - After a troop passes the campsite inspection they are free to depart camp.
 - Note that the camporee patches did not arrive in time so they will be mailed to the troops

Camporee Youth Staff

Youth Staff is set up as a Troop - Scoutmaster, SPL, PLs, and patrols - with the responsibility of running Camporee. It's a big task with hundreds of campers attending, and an amazing occasion for Fun with a purpose. There are unique leadership opportunities and great insights into just what it takes to run a major event.

Participation as a member of Youth Staff is by Scoutmaster nomination only and not all Scouts nominated are accepted. We endeavor to make sure we have a balanced crew from as many Troops and rank levels as practical.

We are asking Scoutmasters to nominate at least one and not more than three Scouts from their Troop and to do so no later than September 3, 2021. Candidate requirements are:

- * Hold First Class, Star, Life or Eagle rank.
- * Be aged at least 14 as of Friday, October 8, 2021.
- * Be aged under 18 as of Sunday, October 10, 2021.
- * Be available to participate for the duration of Camporee.

The Camporee ASM (Youth Staff) and Scoutmaster are responsible for reviewing nominations, selecting candidates, and sending invitations to those candidates to be members of Youth Staff. Troops include and pay for Youth Staff as part of the Troop contingent and the Troop's Camporee Scoutmaster is also responsible for holding those Scout's medical forms and any other required paperwork.

Prior to camp, we hold two training sessions where we explain their roles and responsibilities of Youth Staff. We also undertake some specific Health & Safety training with a focus on 'things that can wrong' in the great outdoors. Everything from simple sightings of rattlesnakes to full blown emergency camp evacuation.

At camp, the Youth Staff troop camps separately from their home Troops - usually in Blue Oak - eats in the Dining Hall along with the Adult Staff, and use the bathroom facilities in the Teel Lodge area. They are also expected to remain available on Sunday to help with closing camp and managing the exodus of campers..

Order of the Arrow Moluk Village



The Order of the Arrow was founded in 1915. Camp Director E. Urner Goodman and Assistant Camp Director Caroll A. Edson searched for a way to recognize select campers for their cheerful spirit in service at Treasure Island Scout Camp in the Delaware River near Philadelphia. As the popularity of the organization spread to other camps, local lodges attended the first national gathering called a Grand Lodge Meeting in 1921.

The Order of the Arrow was one of many camp honor societies that existed at local Scout camps across the country. As the years went on and more camps adopted the Order of the Arrow's program, it gained prominence and became part of the national Boy Scout program in 1934. By 1948, the OA, recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers, became an official part of the Boy Scouts of America. Toward the end of the twentieth century, the OA expanded its focus to include conservation, high adventure, and servant-leadership. Throughout the years, the Order of the Arrow has played an integral role in the program of the Boy scouts and in the community service its members contribute to their communities. To date, more than one million people have been members of the Order of the Arrow.

Presently, the Order of the Arrow consists of nearly 300 lodges which form approximately 48 sections in four regions. Leadership positions and voting rights are restricted to members under the age of 21. Through the program, members live up to the ideals of brotherhood, cheerfulness, and service set forth by the founders.

OA Activities at Camporee 2021

- 1. OA to sell ice cold water and Gatorade (including reduced calorie)
- 2. OA will host a competition event for all troops
- 3. Call out ceremony on Saturday night then take Candidates and Members away for the traditional event
- 4. All Current OA Members are encouraged to wear their OA Sash during the Call Out ceremony

Traffic & Parking

Head of Traffic & Parking: Raj Nagaraj (T84)

What you need to know:

→ For Drop Off:

- Arrival at and departure from Camp is a time for everyone to be on high alert. There's lots of people and vehicle movement, and that's a recipe for trouble if people are not fully engaged and paying attention to ALL instructions from the parking staff.
- We urge Troops to bring Scouts' backpacks in with their equipment vehicle. In previous years, Scouts have hiked in with their backpacks. Now, we want Scouts to hike in without their backpacks. It's a safety thing. The Los Mochos entry area at Mines Rd is very constrained. The crush of people and vehicles, makes unloading Scouts with their backpacks very unsafe and therefore unacceptable.
- Drivers must drop off Scouts in the designated drop off location (see the diagram following) after which Scouts will move to a safe assembly point before hiking into camp and vehicles will leave the area immediately - no site seeing or photo ops.
- We strongly discourage vehicles driving into Camp just to do a drop off, and any that do can expect to wait until after 7:30p before being able to drive out.

Parking is very constrained:

- Carpooling is a necessity.
- We charge \$5/per car to drive into camp and park. Cash only, exact change please.
- All vehicles must back into parking spaces so they are facing out to ensure a quick and safe exit.
- The Manzanita drop off area for Troop camping gear accommodates only a few vehicles at a time. Troops need to consolidate their equipment into one vehicle if at all possible. This consolidation may take place in the main parking area. We work as quickly as possible but delays are inevitable.

→ For Webelos:

 Due to limitations in parking, Webelos must carpool. Follow directions for parking when you arrive form parking staff.



How to know when you've arrived.




Arriving Scouts


Procedures for Drop Off




Camp Layout

Directions - map




