#### Candidate requirements are:

- \* Hold First Class, Star, Life or Eagle rank.
- \* Be aged at least 14 as of Friday, April 12, 2024
- \* Be aged under 18 as of Sunday, April 14, 2024
- \* Be available to participate for the duration of Camporee.

Benefits of coming on board the Meridian Camporee ship as Youth Staff: 1) Camporee shirt & patch 2) Meals, snacks and drinks are provided 3) Designated sleeping area at the campsite 4) Latrine access 5) Special thank you gift from Captain Blackbeard's treasure chest.

Prior to camp, you will be notified by your Recruiter of two training sessions. They will discuss your roles and responsibilities and answer questions. The battle for treasure will be fierce, so specific Health & Safety training with a focus on 'things that can wrong' in the great outdoors will be provided. Everything from simple sightings of rattlesnakes to full blown emergency camp evacuation will be covered. You will also be expected to remain on Sunday to help as the gentlemen Scouts leave camp and ensure proper cleanup of the campsites.

## Registration



- AB 506 Mandated Reporter Training requires ALL registered adults and adult/parent volunteers attending Camporee overnight or for the entire weekend must complete this training before attending Camporee.
- Live Scan background check must be completed by April 12th, 2024.
- Youth Protection Training (YPT) must be current.
- No adults will be able to participate at Camporee without ALL of the required training. Adults who stay overnight should be registered with BSA.
- Each Unit is responsible for collecting and verifying requirements and obtaining the certificates.

Click on either the Troop or Webelos link, sign in or create an account. All scouts will be registered under Youth Participants, including Youth Staff. For Youth Staff, type in "YS" in the dietary restriction box and add any food restrictions. Adults will be registered under Adult Participants. Non-Participating Adults "Parent Helpers" are only for adults NOT camping overnight and assisting your troop at various activities. **You must register as a Unit, not individual,** and there must be a minimum of 2 registered adults. You will receive an emailed invoice of your registration.

March 24th is the deadline to make changes or revise your current registration (i.e. adding or removing participants).

You will be given the option to either pay 80% or the full amount at the completion of registration. The fee schedule is on the next page.

#### Troops & Webelos - here are important registration deadlines:

- All participating Troops must register online by March 13, 2024. Revised registration deadline is March 24, 2024.
- We will base our T-Shirt order on the registration numbers in your March 13, 2024 registration submission.
- Webelos deadline is March 24, 2024.
- The last date to submit a revised Troop registration is March 24, 2024.
- There will be no refunds on overpayments based on current council policy.

#### Notes:

- 1) All scouts and adults attending camporee (including Youth Staff) **MUST** be registered with their Troop using the online registration process.
- 2) Each Unit **MUST** have Medical Forms A, B1 & B2 for ALL participants attending: scouts, adult leaders and parent volunteers. Medical Forms should be kept in a binder with the Unit's Medic and be readily and easily available if needed for any medical issue.
- 3) As needed, all registered adults will be asked to help with events, inspections, and logistics throughout the duration of Camp.
- 4) Scouts who wish to participate in events that involve Archery, Rifles, Tomahawks, or BB guns must bring **four** signed copies of the <u>Parental</u> <u>Firearms Permission</u> form.

You can also design the dessert to conform to the current Camporee theme of *Pirates of the Meridian* (ship, parrots, etc.) Scouts are encouraged to use their interpretation of what a *Swashbuckling Dessert* is.

	You will present your dessert to the judges with a very brief presentation on what you have submitted. They will determine the points to be assigned for each of the scoring requirements.
	Judges will score the desserts on a 120-point scale: 60 points for plating and presentation and 60 points on the main dish.
•	10 Bonus points if your dessert relates to the Pirates of the Meridian theme.
	Patrols with the most points will be presented with either a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place at Sunday's Awards Presentation.

#### **Order of the Arrow** Yerba Buena Lodge Moluk Village



The Order of the Arrow was founded in 1915. Camp Director E. Urner Goodman and Assistant Camp Director Caroll A. Edson searched for a way to recognize select campers for their cheerful spirit in service at Treasure Island Scout Camp in the Delaware River near Philadelphia. As the popularity of the organization spread to other camps, local lodges attended the first national gathering called a Grand Lodge Meeting in 1921.

The Order of the Arrow was one of many camp honor societies that existed at local Scout camps across the country. As the years went on and more camps adopted the Order of the Arrow's program, it gained prominence and became part of the national Boy Scout program in 1934. By 1948, the OA, recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers, became an official part of the Boy Scouts of America. Toward the end of the twentieth century, the OA expanded its focus to include conservation, high adventure, and service-leadership. Throughout the years, the Order of the Arrow has played an integral role in the program of Scouts BSA and in the community service its members contribute to their communities. To date, more than one million people have been members of the Order of the Arrow.

Presently, the Order of the Arrow consists of nearly 275 lodges which form approximately 40 sections in two geographical regions. Leadership positions and voting rights are restricted to members under the age of 21. Through the program, members live up to the ideals of brotherhood, cheerfulness, and service set forth by the founders.





For	Drop Off:
	Arrival and departure from Camp is a time for everyone to be on high alert. There's lots of people and vehicle movement, and that's a recipe for trouble if people are not fully engaged and paying attention to ALL instructions from the parking staff.
	We urge Troops to bring Scout's backpacks with their equipment vehicle. Scouts will hike in without their backpacks for safety. The Los Mochos entry area at Mines Rd is very constrained which makes unloading Scouts with their backpacks very unsafe and therefore unacceptable.
	Scouts must be dropped off in the designated drop off location (see the diagram pg 30). Youth Staff will assist them for their hike into camp. Vehicles will need to leave the area immediately - no photo ops!




## Camp Entrance


#### **Equipment Drop Off & Overnight Parking (#1)**

- Free if only dropping off equipment/supplies and departing campsite.






## Campground Layout




